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### **Behaviour Policy 2023-24**

Dawpool is currently introducing a new behaviour policy which has been carefully developed over several months. Teachers have collaborated to discuss the changes and have received up-to-date training on positive behaviour management during the INSET day earlier this month.

The most significant alteration in the behaviour policy is the elimination of the coloured zones for behaviour. Instead, the approach focuses on the principle of "praise in public and remind in private," and is closely aligned with Dawpool's Christian vision and values.

The new policy aligns with six recommendations that have been outlined in the Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) guidance on Improving Behaviour in Schools (2021).

We value parent and carer opinions on the draft policy and encourage you to read and provide feedback. We value and consider all feedback from parents and carers in further refining the policy over the coming months. The new policy will be fully implemented by September 2023.

This half term, the children have reflected on our **HeartSmart Actions** through the Relationships and Health Education Curriculum.

HeartSmart is a scheme of work that we use to build character, emotional health and resilience in children. It equips them with foundational principles, skills, habits and a mindset that will improve their mental health, relationships and academic achievement. HeartSmart is delivered around 6 key topics:

- Get Heart Smart
- Don't forget to let love in
- Too much selfie isn't healthy
- Don't rub it in, rub it out
- Fake is a mistake
- No way through, isn't true
