
School reopens on Tuesday 18th April

The event made a profit of £238.

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
Thank you to all who brought in donations today for Comic Relief. We raised £203.60, a brilliant effort!

Sickness Absence from School


We would like to share with you some extracts from the NHS guidelines on sickness in children:

When your child is unwell, it can be hard deciding whether to keep them off school. These simple guidelines should help.

Not every illness needs to keep your child from school.

Use common sense when deciding whether or not your child is too ill to attend school. Ask yourself the following questions.

- Is my child well enough to do the activities of the school day? If not, keep your child at home.
- Does my child have a condition that could be passed on to other children or school staff? If so, keep your child at home.
- Would I take a day off work if I had this condition? If so, keep your child at home.
- Cough and cold. A child with a minor cough or cold may attend school. If the cold is accompanied by a raised temperature, shivers or
- drowsiness, the child should stay
 off school, visit the GP and return
 to school 24 hours after they start
 to feel better. If your child has a
 more severe and long-lasting
 cough, consult your GP. They can
 give guidance on whether your
 child should stay off school.
- Chickenpox. If your child has chickenpox, keep them off school until all their spots have crusted over.



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Vomiting and diarrhoea. Children with diarrhoea and/or vomiting should definitely be kept off school until at least 48 hours after their symptoms have gone. Most cases of diarrhoea and vomiting in children get better without treatment, but if symptoms persist, consult your GP.

Hot chocolate will no longer be available.


Payments to School

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
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taking the children to and from St Chad's so please let us know on **Monday** if you can help.




