

To enable Year 4 pupils to contribute to Children in Need, they can come to school in non-school uniform on Monday 21st November.


Children in Need - Friday 18th November




Next FoDS Meeting

Singapore Maths



week we will be sending home information to Key Stage 2 pupils about a 'Make and Learn' Design and Technology club which will start in January.




Operation Christmas Child






