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Introduction

What is the Pupil Premium Grant?

The Pupil Premium Grant is additional funding provided to schools to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities and to close the gaps between these pupils and their peers.

How is the Pupil Premium Grant allocated?

Dawpool receives the Pupil Premium Grant for:

- Children who are eligible for free school meals at any point in the past six years.
- Children who have been looked after under local authority care for more than one day.
- Children whose families have served in the Armed Forces.

In the academic year 2018/19 Dawpool C.E. Aided Primary School will receive **£30,220.00**. This is an initial allocation which may be amended later in the year.

Pupil Premium Grant at Dawpool C.E. Aided Primary

The expenditure of Pupil Premium Grant is strictly monitored at Dawpool C.E. Aided Primary in line with the grant conditions. Dawpool is committed to utilising the Pupil Premium Grant to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils, however it is expected that the outcomes of the grant expenditure will likely improve attainment for all pupils. At the end of the academic year a report measuring the impact of the Pupil Premium Grant will be published on the school website.

Review 2017-18

Pupil Premium funding at Dawpool C.E. Aided Primary was carefully planned, monitored and reviewed during the academic year 2017/18.

Tailored support for pupils was provided through a range of approaches including:

- Deployment of Teaching Assistants to deliver specific interventions
- Reduced teacher to pupil ratios
- Personalised SENCO support and coaching for pupils
- Family Support Worker – tailored support for pupils and families

Dawpool C.E. Aided Primary School purchased subscriptions to a range of online content which Pupil Premium Pupils were able to access for additional support or learning opportunities at home. These included; Indirect Dyslexia Learning Cloud (IDL), Dynamo Maths, Purple Mash & Espresso.

A wide range of extra-curricular opportunities were also offered to pupils. Pupils were able to extend their learning beyond the classroom, develop personal skills and enjoy new experiences.

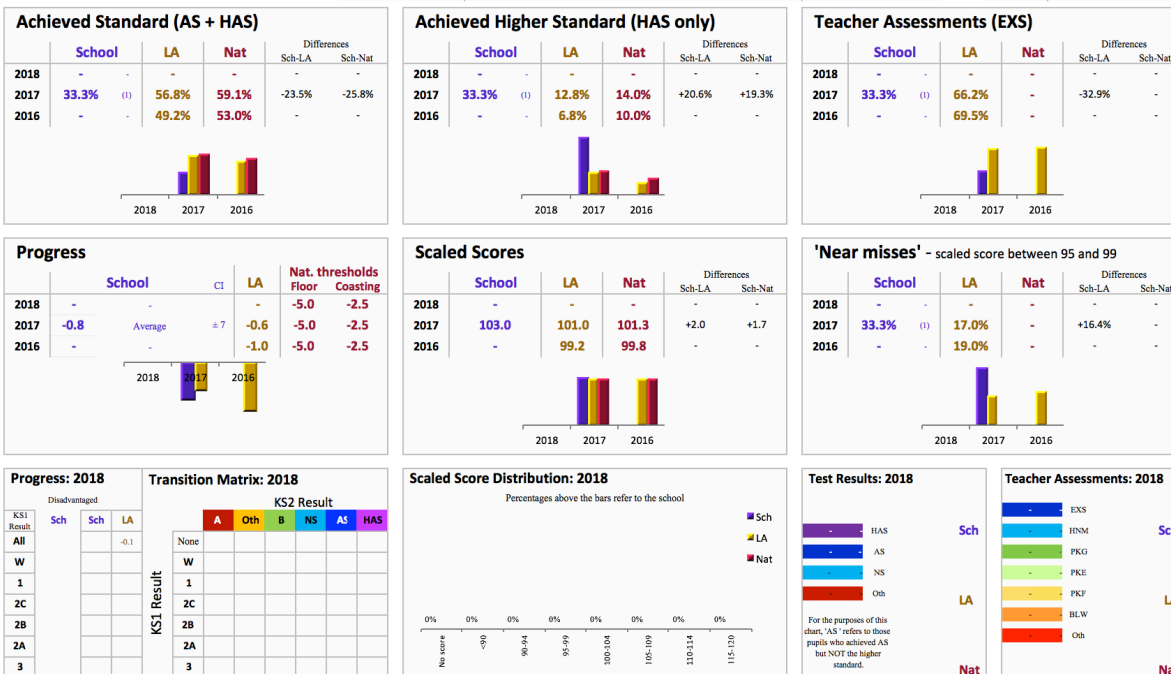

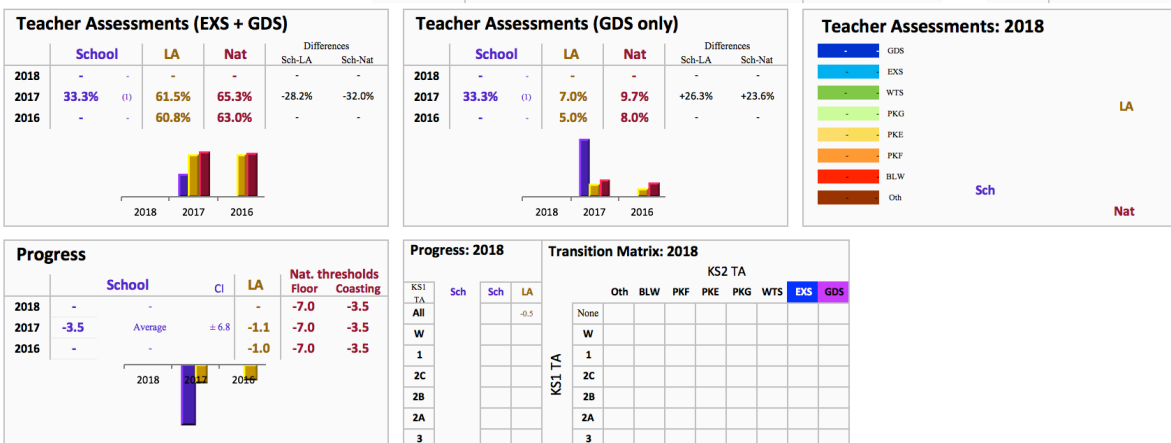

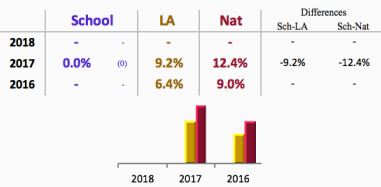

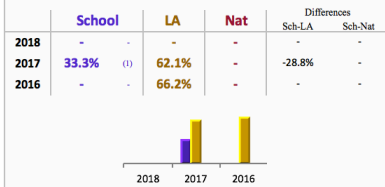
Achieved Standard (AS + HAS)



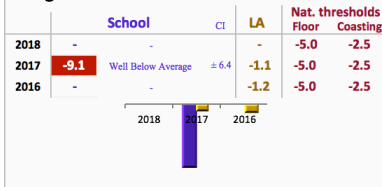
Achieved Higher Standard (HAS only)



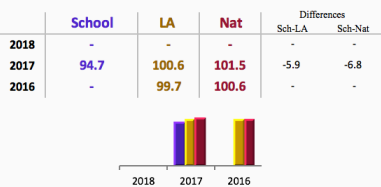

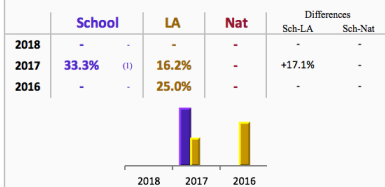

'Near misses' - scaled score between 95 and 99



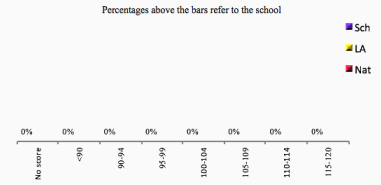

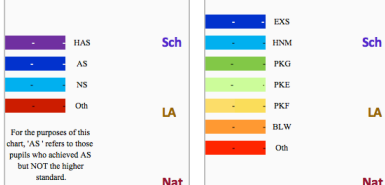

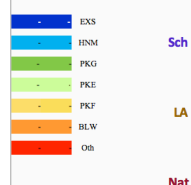
Scaled Score Distribution: 2018

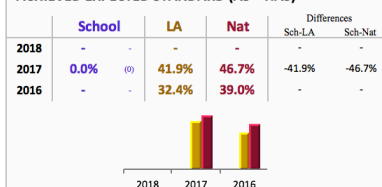

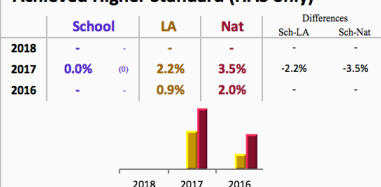

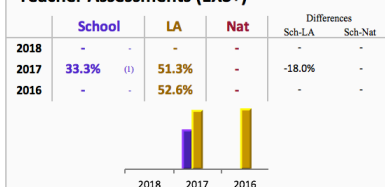

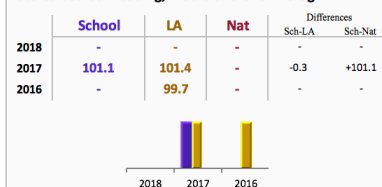
Achieved Higher Standard (HAS only)



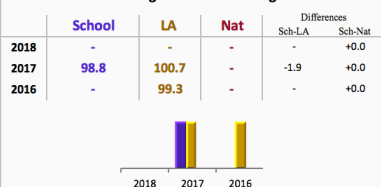

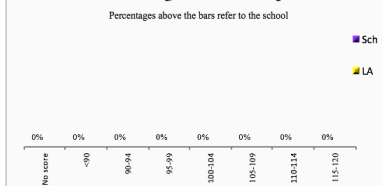
Scaled Scores: Reading, Maths and GPS Average



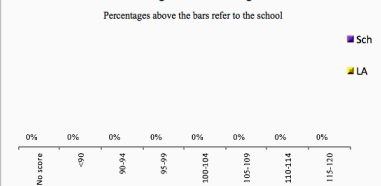
Scaled Scores: Reading and Maths Average

Scaled Score Distribution: Reading and Maths Average - 2018



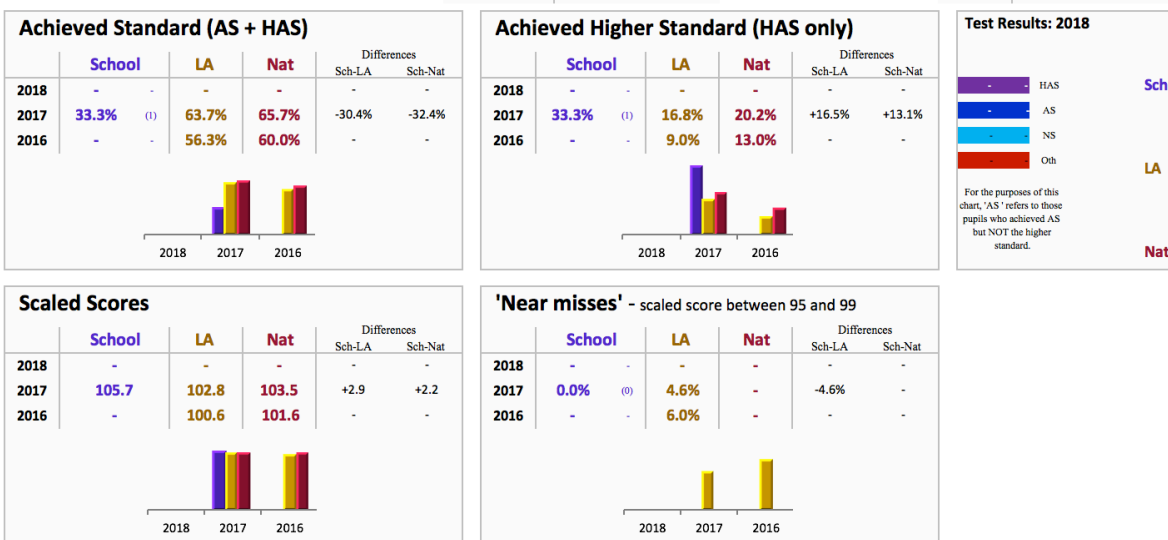

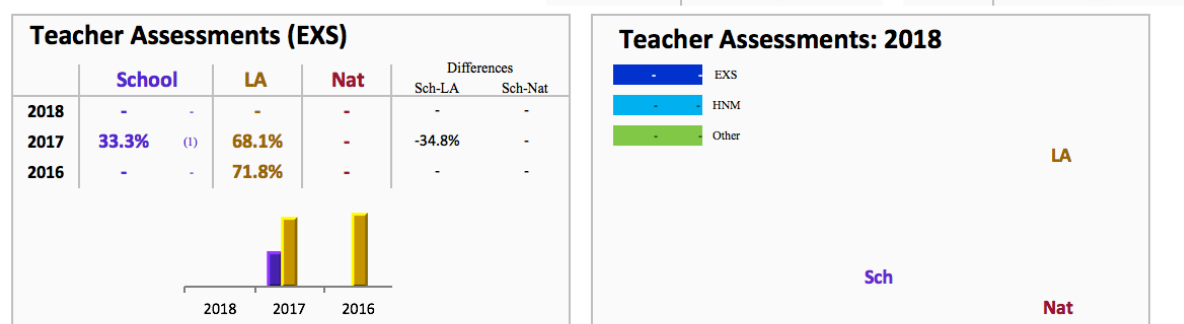

Nature of support 2018/19

Pupil Premium funding at Dawpool C.E. Aided Primary is carefully monitored. Expenditure of Pupil Premium is planned and delivered in a variety of ways that best meet the needs of pupils.

Following a detailed analysis of the progress of the children in each year group, we deploy our teaching assistants in the cohorts where there is extra need. Our highly skilled Teaching Assistants support within the classroom setting and also run a wide selection of interventions to move our pupils forward in their learning. These programmes are monitored and change throughout the year depending upon pupils' progress. This academic year the majority of our Pupil Premium Funding will be used to finance additional hours for Teaching Assistants in every year group to deliver a selection of programmes of study. These are delivered usually in sessions between ten and twenty minutes during an afternoon.

Typical sessions include:

- Maths Intervention
- Reading Intervention
- Focussed Spelling Support
- Maths Challenge Y3, 4, 5 & 6

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- Speech and Language Intervention
- Social and Communication Intervention
- Reading Comprehension and Writing Skills Support
- Indirect Dyslexia Learning Cloud
- Dynamo Maths

The school also uses Pupil Premium Funding to purchase a specialist Family Support Worker to work with individual children and their parents/carers to overcome a range of emotional issues. This could be support for a family who have experienced trauma of some kind, such as bereavement or a family break-up, or where there is conflict in the family which has an adverse effect on the emotional well-being of the child. The support is provided at home, in school or in both localities. It is impossible to measure the impact of such specialised intervention, but the results are very positive. Pupils whose behaviour previously caused concern and had a detrimental effect on the class become more content, less withdrawn and are finally able to access their learning. The introduction of a new online tool 'My Concern' has enabled school to closely track and monitor the support offered to families.

The School SENCO liaises with Educational Psychologists, Health & Well-being agencies and attends regular SENCO cluster meetings to maintain the high standards of provision offered. The SENCO provides advice and guidance to families and personalised support and coaching to pupils. This tailored support is often provided on a 1:1 basis to best meet the needs of the child and family. In 2017/18, this support has included working with 'Talk About Town,' a Paediatric Speech and Language Therapy Service, to support pupils with communication difficulties. Furthermore school has also been able to purchase the QB Check to identify ADHD traits.

Another use of Pupil Premium Funding is to provide financial support for those families who are unable to pay for the many educational trips organised for every class throughout the academic year and the Y6 residential trip. Once again, this can't be measured in data but the ethos of our school is to include every child in every learning opportunity. The funding eases the financial burden on the school as there would be no question of a child ever being excluded for financial reasons.



The school also provides specialist music tuition via the Wirral Wider Opportunities Programme for all Y4 pupils to enable them to have the experience of playing a musical instrument for a whole year. Some pupils go on to take up an orchestral instrument. It has been recognised that learning to play a musical instrument develops self-discipline and fosters the ability for independent learning.

Pupil Premium funding is also used to purchase equipment that will support pupils to access the curriculum. This includes technology such as Laptops or manipulatives for use across the curriculum.

This year the school will continue to offer a wide range of extra-curricular activities for all pupils. These opportunities for learning will be across a breadth of areas including activities such as Choir, Chess, Worship Group and a wide variety of sports in all Key Stages. Pupils will also have the opportunity to participate in competitive events such as Football, Chess and Cross Country events.

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

Dawpool C.E. Aided Primary will evaluate the impact on pupil attainment throughout this academic year through careful tracking and analysis of data. Interventions will be adapted to meet pupils' needs and staff deployed accordingly.
