

We will be placing a uniform order next week so if you need anything for September please get your order in by Thursday 27th June. Thank you.


Summer Building Work

During the Summer holidays, there will be some work taking place in school to replace internal doors and to improve security and fire safety. As part of this work, we will be removing all coat pegs from the main school corridor and installing cloakroom units for storing the children's coats, bags and belongings.



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In the interests of health and safety, and to enable better standards of housekeeping, we ask all parents to <u>minimise your child's belongings</u>. The following items will be sufficient for every child:

- A coat (named)
- A book bag (named)
- A drawstring PE bag (named)
- A water bottle (no single-use plastics, please)
- A small lunchbox (if required)

Your child's water bottle, lunchbox and book bag will be kept within the classrooms. Your child's coat and drawstring PE bag will be kept on their peg.

Please note that book bags, drawstring PE bags and water bottles may be purchased through the school office. Alternatively, you may buy these items from your preferred supplier.

From September, we will not have the space to store backpacks, additional sports bags and carrier bags. We will be

encouraging all pupils to take their minimal belongings home at the end of each day. We would also like pupils who participate in extra-curricular sports clubs to get into the habit of using their drawstring PE bag to carry sportswear to and from school.

Thank you for helping us to improve the safety and tidiness of our school environment.

Summer Reading Challenge 2019



The summer holiday is fast approaching and Wirral Libraries are, once again, taking part in the Reading Agency's Summer Reading Challenge. This year's

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Reading Challenge is called 'Space Chase' and celebrates the 50th anniversary of the moon landings. It will run from <u>Saturday 13th July until</u> <u>Saturday 31st August</u>.

The scheme helps maintain reading levels over the summer and encourages all children to be more confident and enthusiastic about their reading choices.

We invite all pupils to visit their local library four times over the summer holidays, reading at least two books per visit and collecting stickers and rewards for the books that they read. Every child who takes part will receive a certificate and any child reading 6 books, or more, will also receive a medal.

There will be a special trophy awarded to the schools whose pupils demonstrate the most enthusiasm for, or have shown to have benefited most from taking part in the Challenge. A librarian will visit these schools in the Autumn to present the award and the children's medals. Let's strive to win a trophy!

During worship this week, all of the children were clearly moved by the effects of plastic pollution which has gained much attention in the media recently. At Dawpool, we want to do everything that we can to reduce our use of single-use plastics and encourage everyone at home to do the same.

We thank FoDS who share the children's concerns and have agreed to recycle as much waste as possible at fundraising events.

Next week, some of our pupils will be going to Thurstaston Beach to participate in a beach clean and will be working with the Shore Cottage Art Studio to create a 3D sculpture of a spoonbill, a wetland bird whose habitat is threatened by plastic pollution.



The sculpture will be displayed in a special exhibition at the Lady Lever Art Gallery in Port Sunlight for the duration of the Summer Holidays – we hope you will be able to visit. Thank you to Mr and Mrs Heath at Shore Cottage for hosting the children.
