

Dear Parents,

Oaklands is now fast approaching and we appreciate that you may have last minute worries. Please find enclosed in this letter as much detailed information as we can give you to ease those worries and help you to prepare for your child's departure.

The dates for the trip are Sunday 8th July-Tuesday 10th July 2018

Please find attached the following documents:

- A booklet containing information about the visit. This is written in a 'question & answer' format and will hopefully answer most of your questions.
- A kit list detailing everything that your child will need to bring with them.
- A Parent/Guardian consent form (to be returned to Mrs Lee by Monday 2nd July)
- A 'Request for Administering Medicines' form (only to be completed if your child requires medicines to be administered during the residential. This form and any medication should be handed to Mrs Earp before we depart on **Sunday 8**th **July**).

Departure Arrangements

The children should arrive at school at **8:45am on Sunday 8th July**, dressed in tracksuits, suitable walking footwear and a coat. They should bring their <u>one suitcase/ bag</u> straight into the hall, making sure there is nothing in there that will break or leak.

The only hand luggage the children will need to bring is as follows:

- Any medicine (accompanied by the school's 'Request for Administering Medicines' form) that should be given straight from the parent to Mrs Earp.
- A packed lunch in a carrier bag.
- <u>Please do not send your children with sweets</u> as there is a tuck shop at the centre which we will open daily at set times. This helps us monitor the children's sugar intake and ensures that food is not taken into the bedrooms.

We will depart from school by coach at 9:15am. On arrival at Oaklands, the children will be briefed by the centre instructors and kitted out with a list of clothing. Each piece of kit is colour-coded and numbered so that the centre can keep track of all equipment, therefore please stress to your child that it is their responsibility to look after their kit carefully.

Oaklands Activities

The range of activities available at The Oaklands Centre in wide and varied. During the course, the children will have the opportunity to engage in a selection of the following activities:

- Hill Walking
- Rock Climbing
- Abseiling
- Gorge Walking
- Caving
- Canoeing
- · Problem solving
- Orienteering

The activities chosen are often determined by the weather or other additional factors. All activities are risk assessed according to Local authority procedures. If any medical emergencies should arise, all school staff and Oakland's instructors are first aid trained.

We have taken the decision not to allow the children to telephone home during our stay and for a variety of important reasons, **mobile phones are strictly prohibited**. All parent contact numbers are taken with us to allow us to call you if an emergency arises.

From Monday morning, 9th July, we hope to upload photographs of the activities onto the school's Twitter feed, '@DawpoolCofE'. Please ensure you have returned the attached consent form if you wish for your child to be included in these photographs.

We will arrive back on Tuesday 10th July at approximately 2:15pm. You are welcome to collect your child from school at this time. If there is any delay, we will inform school and keep you updated via the Twitter feed. Please find attached a kit list detailing everything that your child will need to bring with them as well as a Parent/Guardian consent form. Please return this form to Mrs Lee by Monday 2nd July.

Thank you for your co-operation in all of the above. We have attached a booklet which hopefully answers most of your questions. Please don't hesitate to contact us if you any further questions.

What activities will the children do in the daytime?

Likely events include:

- Hill Walking
- Rock Climbing
- Abseiling
- Gorge Walking
- Caving
- Canoeing
- Problem solving
- Orienteering

The activities chosen are often determined by the weather or other additional factors.

All daytime activities are led by Oaklands instructors. Outdoor evening activities are led by the school staff.

Safety is of paramount importance at the Oaklands centre. Oaklands staff hold outdoor qualifications at the highest levels and have first aid qualifications. All equipment is regularly maintained and inspected.

Operating within the Wirral Authority's Safety Policy, the Centre assures the highest standard of safety at all times. Oaklands is fully Risk Assessed for all the Outdoor Activities and is an Adventure Activities Licensed Centre (AALC) conforming to HSE regulations.

What activities will the children do in the evenings?

Likely events include:

- Night walk
- · Team challenges
- Problem solving activities
- Production rehearsals
- Journal writing

Evening activities will be led by the school staff.

Are you going to make the children do all of the activities?

Children will be encouraged to take part in all the activities. There is enormous satisfaction in overcoming fears. The children are encouraged to support and motivate each other. Activities are designed to allow children to take part at their own pace and level of confidence. In cases of severe anxiety, children will not be forced to take part.

How much free time will the children get?

Children will be given <u>small</u> amounts of free time. We recommend the children bring a favourite reading book, magazine or puzzle book. (Please <u>no</u> electronic consoles, mobile phones, ipods, ipads or anything of value). **Mobile** phones are strictly prohibited.

Ratio of 1:5 for all outdoor activities.

Are staff available 24 hours a day?

School staff are available for the children 24 hours a day and will attend all activities.

How do I know how the children are getting on?

A selection of photographs of the children taking part in the activities will be available to view on Twitter @DawpoolCofE from Monday morning, 9th July. Please return the consent form to Mrs Lee by Monday 2nd July if you wish your child to be included in these photographs.

The children <u>must not bring mobile phones</u>. Parents should not attempt to make contact with their child, unless in an emergency.

Remember, no news is good news!

What if I need to contact my child in an emergency?

In an emergency, parents should contact school first. Out of school hours, the telephone number for the Oaklands Centre is **01690 710500**

Can my child be given medication?

All school staff and Oaklands Instructors are first aid trained.

School staff have parents' emergency contact details. Please ensure these details are correct before we depart.

All medication and the 'Request for Administering Medicine' form should be brought to school on the morning of **Sunday 8th July** and be handed directly to **Mrs Earp**.

What will the children eat?

Meals are provided at Oaklands by Metro Catering

Breakfast: Full English breakfast.

Cereal, Fruit Juice, Toast

Lunch Packed Lunch.

Sandwiches, crisps, fruit, biscuit, drink.

Dinner Cooked evening meal and a dessert (e.g. Fish & Chips, Roast

Dinner)

Please speak to the school staff before departure if your child has any dietary requirements.

Will my child need any spending money?

Children should bring no more than £10. The souvenir and tuck shop at Oaklands will open in the evenings. School staff will look after the children's

money out of shop opening hours to ensure it doesn't get lost. All spending money should be given to **Mrs Young** on the morning of **Sunday 8th July**. Ideally, children should bring coins instead of notes. Spending money should be stored in a <u>named</u> purse or a wallet.

Can the children take any food or sweets?

No. All food will be provided by Oaklands. The Oaklands Centre has a strict policy regarding food items being consumed out of the dining area. There is strictly no eating in the dormitories.

Will the children be split into groups?

The children will be split into 3 groups for all outdoor activities and housekeeping tasks. The children will be consulted about their groups beforehand and we aim to ensure they're with close friends during the activities.

What are the sleeping arrangements?

Children will be split into single sex dormitories. The dormitories accommodate different numbers of children and they will be allocated rooms on arrival at Oaklands. School staff will be allocated rooms in close proximity to the dormitories. The children will not be allowed to spend free time in the dormitories. Dormitories are for sleeping only!

What are the housekeeping arrangements?

The children will work in their groups on the following housekeeping duties:

- Dining room duties
- · Tidying communal areas

Is there anything else I need to do?

Please ensure that the 'Parent / Guardian Consent Form' and the 'Permission to include photographs on Twitter' is returned to **Mrs Lee** by **Monday 2**nd **July**.

Ensure that all items on the kit list are packed and, where possible, named.

On the morning of **Sunday 8th July**, give any medicines and 'Medical Administration Forms' to **Mrs Earp** and any spending money to **Mrs Young**.

If you have any further questions, please don't hesitate to ask. Most importantly, please don't worry!



Suggested Kit List for Weekend or Split Week Residential at Oaklands

Dawpool CE (A) Primary, during your course from Sunday, 08 July 2018 to Tuesday, 10 July 2018. Oaklands can kit you up with all specialist equipment, including waterproofs, fleece jumpers, wellies, boots, etc.

We do some pretty crazy things so it's **better to bring older clothing** for the activities! You are also likely to have to walk from your coach to the Centre (about 1/2 KM so make sure you have some good shoes on and a jacket on your coach trip to the Centre! If arriving in the evening it is also worth having a torch for the walk up the road.

Here's a list of the sort of things you'll need during your course:

- Lunch and drink for your first day
- 2 Warm sweaters
- Woolly/Warm hat
- Warm Jacket
- 3 T Shirts / shirts
- 2 Pairs of track suit bottoms or similar (not jeans!)
- 2 Pairs of thick socks (not trainer socks)
- 1 Pair of old trainers
- Slippers or soft indoor shoes
- Pair of shorts (summer)
- Nightwear
- Swimwear
- Underwear for 3 days
- Additional casual clothes for indoor use

- Some money for spending (the Centre has a tuck shop, which sells sweets, drinks and small souvenirs)
- Paper and pencil
- Large plastic bag for wet clothes
- Any medicine you take on a regular basis
- Toiletries (do not forget your toothbrush)
- Towel
- Torch

In the Summer

- Sun cream Factor 20 at least
- Sunhat
- Sunglasses

In the Winter


Extra socks and jumpers




