Summer Reading Challenge 2019



The summer holiday is fast approaching and Wirral Libraries are, once again, taking part in the Reading Agency's Summer Reading Challenge. This year's Reading Challenge is called 'Space Chase' and celebrates the 50th anniversary of the moon landings. It will run from It will run from <u>Saturday</u> 13th July until Saturday 31st August. The scheme helps maintain reading levels of the summer and encourages all children to be more confident and enthusiastic about the reading choices.

We invite all pupils to visit their local library four times over the summer holidays, reading at least two books per visit and collecting stickers and rewards for the books that they read. Every child who takes part will receive a certificate and any child reading 6 books, or more, will also receive a medal.

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There will be a special trophy awarded to the schools whose pupils demonstrate the most enthusiasm for, or have shown to have benefited most from taking part in the Challenge. A librarian will visit these schools in the autumn to present the award and the children's medals. Let's strive to win a trophy!

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Children's Safety

At the start and end of the school day, whilst adults are waiting to drop off or collect the children, we have observed younger siblings being allowed to play unsafely in the small playground, for example playing on the steps, climbing on tables and benches and swinging on the ropes and metal handrails. Please note this also applies to some of our pupils who are aware they are not allowed to play in these areas during the school day so we would request you follow the same guidelines once they are in your care. Please be vigilant to the safety of all children at the end of the school day. Thank you for your support.

To comply with strict fire safety and health and safety guidelines, we will be implementing a 'clear corridor' policy in September. During the Summer holiday we will be removing coat pegs from the corridors and installing cloakroom units.



We ask all parents to <u>minimise your</u> <u>child's belongings</u>. The following items will be sufficient for every child:

- A coat (named)
- A book bag (named)
- A drawstring PE bag (named)
- A water bottle (no single-use plastics, please)
- A small lunchbox (if required)

Please note that book bags, drawstring PE bags and water bottles may be purchased through the school office. Alternatively, you may buy these items from your preferred supplier.

From September, we will not have the space to store backpacks, additional sports bags and carrier bags.
