In this he came up against a French boy who beat him and went on to make it to the semi-finals. Alfie also played in the doubles competition and made it through to the Quarter finals where he and his partner lost in three tight sets, great learning and experiences.

'I do not really have a goal, just play my best and enjoy it'

Alfie returned home having had a great opportunity to develop and expand his tennis skills and experiences by competing in an incredible competition. Well done.
