Introduction

Dawpool Church of England (Aided) Primary School is an Anglican School and the religious education it provides is in conformity with the rites, practices and doctrines of the Church of England. The daily act of collective worship is viewed as 'the heartbeat' of the school. Through this and in the general ethos of the school we seek to promote our vision:

'The Dawpool community are united in their ambition to create a school which embodies the person, love and work of Jesus Christ: a school which enables Christian values to flourish and where all children may experience the abundant life that Jesus offers.'

Worship is a time where we come together to share our love of God and celebrate our achievements together. The worship of the school is based on promoting the Christian values which permeate the ethos of the school. As such, the contributions of staff, pupils, church clergy and other visitors are valued highly.

Worship is when we meet to acknowledge and reflect in God's word and the teachings of Jesus. It is where we acknowledge an infinitely larger world we inhabit and where we are touched, however fleetingly, by its mystery, awe and wonder.

Christian Values

The school's values are known as the 'Fruits of the Spirit'. The Fruit of the Spirit is a biblical term that sums up nine attributes of a Christian according to Paul the Apostle in his Epistle to the Galatians:

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control."

We blend Christian, Biblical teaching and Values Education in order to create opportunities for children to develop physically, emotionally, personally, socially, mentally and intelligently. We do this by following a weekly structure:

Each Year Group will lead an Act of Worship for parents once per year.

Pupils will also lead the Sunday Service at St Chad's Church once per term.

Legal background

We accept that:

"All pupils in attendance at a maintained school shall on each day take part in an act of collective worship" unless "the parent . . . requests that he may be wholly or partly excused from attendance at religious worship in the school" [1988 Education Reform Act 6(1) and 9(3)]

We acknowledge the parents' right to withdraw their children and the school will make alternative arrangements for the supervision of the child during the period concerned. At present no children are withdrawn from collective worship. We make it clear that the act of worship is central to the life of the school and is not an occasion for evangelism. We also affirm that the withdrawal of pupils from collective worship would not isolate them from the Christian teaching the school gives.

For our school:

"The daily act of collective worship required by law in the school shall be consistent with the faith and practice of the Church of England."

Worship Aims

Through our collective worship we aim to provide the opportunity for pupils to:

- 1. Worship God as Trinity
- 2. Consider spiritual and moral issues and to explore their own beliefs
- 3. To participate and respond whether through active involvement in the presentation of worship or through listening to and joining in the worship offered
- 4. Develop community spirit and community cohesion



- 5. Promote a common ethos, shared values and reinforce positive attitudes
- 6. Be taught how to worship

HeartSmart Worship

There are twelve strands to 'HeartSmart' which will be explored during Worship every Monday:

1. Get HeartSmart

We want the children to know that we all have a body, a mind and a heart. The heart is the epicentre of who we are, the driving force of why we do what we do. We want the children to understand that there are times to listen to our heart and times to lead our heart. Jesus says in Matthew 22: 36-40 that loving God and loving others and ourselves are the two greatest commandments. If we want to live well, we need to love well. This is what it means to be HeartSmart.

2. Get HeartSmart

The heart is effectively a pump. It pumps out what comes in. Biologically speaking, this is blood. Emotionally speaking, this is our friends, what we watch, how we think and what we surround ourselves with. We aim to encourage children to consider what they allow in to their hearts and to equip them in the area of self-regulation. We want them to know that they have a choice of what they allow into their hearts and to understand what we mean and don't mean when we use the word, 'love'.

3. Don't Forget to Let Love in

We want children to know that they are valued, that they are one in a million and that they are loved. We want them to consider who in their life makes them feel safe, valued and loved as well as understanding that God is a God of love who created them to be loved by Him. We explore the way in which children understand that they're loved by looking at the 5 love languages. We want children to reflect on their value and grow in self-acceptance and love.

4. Don't Forget to Let Love in

'Letting Love In' is all about listening to God's voice that says "you're one in a million, you have value, dignity and purpose". We focus on the true and false voices that we can hear in our heads. It helps children tune into God's voice of love and recognise any other voice should be ignored. Instead of trash, they are treasure, instead of being pointless they have purpose and instead of only having one chance they always have a second chance to thrive.



5. Too Much Selfie isn't Healthy

There are 7.4billion people in the world. We want children to know that they are loved but HeartSmart is about loving others too, as Jesus says, *"love your neighbour as yourself"*. We want children to explore the happiness that comes by thinking about themselves less and considering others more. We want to create a culture defined by empathy and the #unselfie challenge will help to encourage this.

6. Too Much Selfie isn't Healthy

We announce the #Unselfie Challenge results and make space for children's #Unselfie stories. We want children to learn about the importance of getting along with others and to explore three ways of growing in empathy. They are (i)listening well by being interested, (ii)looking up from our screens and (iii)looking out, being aware of the needs around us.

7. Don't rub it in, Rub it Out

We want children to know that when they get hurt they often want to get even. The drive to make things fair is strong. They want to rub it in, get their own back, let that person know that they're not ok. But this ends up hurting themselves. The only way through hurt is to rub it out. Forgiveness is the best gift that they can give themselves and it's an important theme in the Bible, it even finds it's way into the LORD's prayer.

8. Don't rub it in, Rub it Out

We focus on the importance of letting the hurt out, not burying it, but letting it out. How do we handle negative emotions, let them out, without damaging others in the process? Where do you go? Who do you talk to? What do you do when you're feeling blue? If our leg hurts we might sit down, if we have a headache we might lie down or take a tablet. What do we do when our heart hurts?

9. Fake is a Mistake

We want the children to consider why they tell lies and the consequences when they do. Telling the truth requires courage, nevertheless we want children to choose to resolve to tell the truth always. We want them to understand that this not only shows love towards others but also towards themselves and to God. Telling the truth is the cornerstone of true friendship.

10. Fake is a Mistake

One of the ways that we can be fake is by pretending that we're something that we're not. We want to be liked. We want the children to know that being '*Fake is a Mistake*!' because the real them is better than anyone or anything that they might pretend to be. We want them to enjoy who they are and to be true to themselves and others.

11. No Way Through isn't True

We want children to know that when they face challenging situations, they don't need to give up. We want them to know that there is always a way through. In every situation, maths, reading, friendship there is an opportunity for children to respond with hope. We want them to know that the first part of finding the solution and way through is by believing that there is one. We want the children to grow in perseverance and to put this into practice in the classroom.

12. No Way Through isn't True


HeartSmart is about love. Our hearts are made healthy by love. Love is what makes our heart smart. Believing that there's always a way through or to say it another way - *hope* is the fruit of a healthy heart. Hope is a position of heart, a decision that comes from our hearts. *'No Way Through' isn't True* shows that we love ourselves enough to never give up, to prevail and believe always and it shows that we love others enough to always see the potential lying dormant within.

'The Story' Worship

There are thirty-one chapters to 'The Story' which will be explored during Worship every Wednesday and during classroom-based Worship. 'The Story' is a chronological journey through the Bible and presents the big picture of God's enormous Love for His children. 'The Story' Worship is delivered by pupils.

'The Story' Worship is linked to the Bible Bookcase display in the school's main corridor.

Worship Structure

When planning collective worship, we build in a spiritual dimension with opportunities for prayer, reflection and quiet. Children are invited to pray or sing and there is a sense of respect for the integrity of our pupils. We regard it as a special time and expect children to behave in an appropriate way. Each Act of Worship will follow a familiar structure:

1.	Music playing as children enter – relevant to topic. The screen is used to display slides or videos with questions, reflections and prompts.	
2.	Welcome and Good Morning	
	On a Monday morning – The Worship Chest

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	ALL: Jesus is at the heart of our school. Worship Leader: We take out the Bible and open it to remind us that ALL: God speaks to us through His word.
3.	Light the candle(s) Worship Leader: The Lord is Here ALL: His Spirit is with us.
4.	Where are we on the Bible Bookcase? Bible reference(s) displayed Focus of the Worship – The Learning
5.	Reflection – may include responses from the children.
6.	Worship Song
7.	Prayers – can be relevant to the topic; School Prayer; The Lord's Prayer remember time for personal prayer. At the end of prayers: Worship Leader : <i>We ask this in Jesus' name</i> ALL : <i>Amen</i>
8.	Closing God's message (as you leave the hall today think about) Worship Leader : Go in peace to love and serve the Lord. In the name of Christ. ALL: Amen.
