

Home Learning Procedure 2020



Guidance to support pupils and families during a school closure

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1. Introduction

This booklet will provide parents and carers with guidance on how to support children at home during a school closure.


Please note that the procedures outlined in this guide will begin on **Monday 23rd March 2020** until the school is instructed to reopen for all pupils.

We appreciate that each family's own circumstances will influence the nature of any time away from school and it will be the parents and carers best judgements as to the amount of work the children complete.

2. Foundation 2 to Year 6

For resources to support your child's learning at home, please go to our school website: https://www.dawpool.wirral.sch.uk/website

Click on the *Home Learning* tab at the top of the homepage and select your child's year group:



All home learning activities will be available here.

During the school closure, your child's class teacher will plan lessons as normal and make the work accessible on the *Home Learning* pages.

From 09:00 every morning (Monday-Friday in term-time), your child's class teacher will provide a daily bulletin with learning objectives, downloadable resources and links to further activities. If you are unable to print out the teacher's recommended worksheets or activities, pupils can record their work in the exercise book that has been sent home (you may also wish to provide your own). In addition, some teachers may have sent home some paper-based work.

To ensure that your child's learning is accurately focused on the correct areas of the curriculum, we advise parents and carers to prioritise the work outlined by the class teacher in the daily bulletin.

Please note that if the class teacher becomes unwell, and is therefore unavailable for work, the daily bulletin may not be provided and parents and carers will be informed about this on the *Home Learning* pages. In such circumstances, we have identified some further resources that you can use to support your child's learning at home.

3. Purple Mash

Your child has a subscription to Purple Mash which hosts a variety of curriculum focused activities, creative tools, programs and games to support and inspire creative learning.

Please enter the username and password which has been sent home with your child.




If you need a reminder of your child's login details, please contact your child's class teacher via the email address referenced at the end of this document.

As part of the daily bulletin, class teachers may direct pupils to complete specific activities (2Dos) within Purple Mash. When a task has been set by the class teacher, it will appear in the top left of the Purple Mash homepage as an alert:




Additionally, your child may wish to use the search bar within Purple Mash to explore more activities if desired.

Your child's class teacher will set reading activities in their daily bulletin. Additionally, the 'Serial Mash' resource within Purple Mash provides your child with an extensive library of fiction books to suit all ages and interests with supplementary comprehension and grammar activities.


- 2. Register for a home account using your email address and password.

8. Foundation 1

Below are some ideas that parents and carers may find useful for helping your child learn at home.

Believe us when we say, your children already learn so much by completing day to day activities.

Independence

 Continue to allow your child to develop their independence by dressing themselves and helping get themselves ready.

Maths

- Maybe children could help make their own breakfast, lunch or dinner? We know they love using the weighing scales when we have them out in the classroom!
- Counting the stairs as you walk up them. Can children correct you if you miss a number out?
- Lots of containers in the bath for measuring capacity.
- Shapes hunt around the house.

Technology

 Lots of online resources are available. Can you watch clips and then ask children questions about it? Who? What? When? Why? Children love finding out new information using the internet.

Literacy/Phonics

- Lots of singing and stories. Maybe you could video the children singing?
- Can children re-call parts of the story?
- What letters can you spot in the story? Can children write any?
- Can children draw their favourite character?
- Name writing.
- Eye-spy.
- Drawing pictures/writing lists/making cards.

Creative

- What can you use around the house to make musical instruments?
- Icing biscuits.
- Paper crafts.
- Lego/construction materials.
- Cutting activity this can be as simple as cutting their own shapes out of scrap. paper and then making a picture with them.

9. Tapestry

Foundation 1 parents and carers are familiar with tapestry and how we use it to upload photographs and observations of children. We will be using the app to provide you with daily challenges or ideas of activities for you to complete at home. Please remember that everything you do with your children is a learning opportunity and they are continually learning new things about the world around them.

We have provided your child with an exercise book (alternatively you may like to provide your own). There is no expectation for this to be used but it might come in useful to record pictures, photographs, notes of activities etc.

10. <u>Communication</u>

During school hours (Mon-Fri, 09:00-15:30), you can email your child's class teacher for advice about your child's learning. The class teacher will aim to respond to you as soon as possible within school hours.


