- Resilience
- Introducing mindfulness

- Self-worth
- Compassion for oneself
- Communication
- Seeking help and support

The sessions are very interactive and inclusive and Year 5 pupils are enjoying them immensely.

Focus Question: Should we always give people a second chance?

News Story: In certain regions of South Africa, when someone does something wrong, he is taken to the centre of the village and surrounded by his tribe for two days while they speak of all the good he has done. They believe that each person is good, yet sometimes we make mistakes. They unite in this ritual to encourage the person to reconnect with his true nature. The belief is that unity and affirmation have more power to change behaviour than shame and punishment. This is known as *ubuntu* – humanity towards others.

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British Value: Mutual Respect - A second chance can mean a fresh start for people who may otherwise find it difficult to be forgiven. Everyone should be treated with dignity and respect, despite their mistakes.
